## This Month in History

Pulteney— April 1902--Dr. B. J. Titus Pulteney, who has been traveling for the past three months in the South, has returned and is prepared to treat la Grippe, Diphtheria, Typhoid, Scarlet, and Typhoid Malaria Fever; also all cases of Chronic Ulcer, Fistular and Abscesses cured in the shortest possible time. Consulting immediately if you are ailing. Charges reasonable. Consultation free if treatment is taken. — On Friday evening, April 11, ladies aid society of the Presbyterian Church will hold a social inn Haddens Hall.

Catawba— April 1928--Grange economics committee will serve a cafeteria supper at the Grange Hall Tuesday evening, April 17, from 6 o'clock until all are served. Quite a delegation of king's daughters from Pulteney and vicinity attended the June meeting held at Mrs. Elmer Sullivan's and bath. Wednesday afternoon. Miss Sarah Parker, and Philippine costume, gave a most interesting talk about the work being done among the lepers in the Philippines.

Pine Grove— April 1911--Charles D Stone has moved back on his farm, which was recently vacated by Ronald Wyckoff family who have moved to Morrison's farmhouse. Myrtle Dunn has moved his family to Pennsylvania.-- Much sickness prevails in our midst, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Bacon have been very sick but are recovering now. Mrs. Ida Roloston is somewhat improved at this writing.
